02. In opening speech, the Project Director, Project Implementation Unit (PIU), Communication and Works Department (C&WD), Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (GoKP), Peshawar welcomed the participants at the pre-proposal meeting. Thereafter, the Project Director explained in detail, the salient features of the Project, its aims, objectives, major components of the Project, its implementation schedule and overall utility of the services to the general public to be provided through this project.

03. Deputy Director (Contract Management / Coordination) with the assistance of Procurement Consultant explained the RFP document particularly the contents of Section-2 (Instructions to Consultants and Data Sheet), Section-3 (Technical Proposal – Standard Forms), Section-4 (Financial Proposal – Standard Forms); Section-7 (Terms of Reference); and Part-II (Conditions of Contract and Contract Forms). The meeting was held in two parts. During the first part, it was explained by reading through the important clauses of RFP on preparation of proposal.

04. During second part of the meeting, the representative of the shortlisted consortiums was invited for any queries. The representatives of the shortlisted consortiums were advised to submit their written query(s) to PIU, for written replies / advice accordingly. The queries raised by the shortlisted consortium were mainly related to the TOR's, budget, person inputs and extension of proposal submission. In response to queries, Deputy Director (Contract Management / Coordination) informed that replies to the queries will be provided in writing. It was also decided that the shortlisted consortiums will submit their queries by COB 12 March 2025.

05. The meeting was concluded with a vote of thanks to and from all the participants. The queries received in PIU and corresponding replies thereto are attached as **Annexure-A**.


